Chief Officer Report

1. Greater Manchester Devolution 6 month Review/GMH&SC 6 month progress review

The document attached is a report on the first six months operation following Greater Manchester Health and Social Care devolution from 1st of April 2016. The report highlights the significant process made in a number of areas and indicates the priorities we are focusing on moving forward. The Board will be updated on progress on a regular basis.

2. Urgent Care System Decision

On the 18th January, the Governing Body approved the proposed redesign of the Urgent Care system for Bury including the ceasing of the walk-in centre services. The proposed timetable for the implementation of these changes is the 1st of April 2017 for the Bury WiC facility and 1st of October 2017 for the Prestwich WiC.

I am in discussion with the Chair of the Bury Health Scrutiny Committee as to the formal consultation requirements now this decision has been made, following a comprehensive engagement with the public. A verbal update will be provided at the Governing Body Meeting.

3. Pennine Care CQC Report

Since the November Governing Body meeting the CQC have published a report into the services provided by Pennine Care Trust. The CQC have assessed Pennine Care as 'requires improvement' for the services that they provide. Pennine Care are developing an action plan to address these issues and a presentation on the CQC report findings and the actions taken to improve services will be given by Pennine Care at the March Governing Body meeting.

4. North West Ambulance Service CQC Report

The CQC have just published their report into the services provided by North West Ambulance Service (see briefing attached). The CQC has assessed that the emergency ambulance service 'requires improvement' although the service has been assessed as 'good for care'. In addition the 111 service which is now provided by North West Ambulance Service has been assessed as 'good'. The ambulance service will be implementing an improvement plan to address the issues highlighted by the CQC and progress in addressing these issues will be reported to future Governing Body meetings.
