## **1. Introduction**

This briefing has been prepared in order to provide Primary Care Commissioning Committee (PCCC) with an overview of the work currently being discussed/progressed via the Primary Care Workstream Group (PCWG) and any associated risks to delivery.

## **2. Primary Care Workstream Group (5 July 2017)**

### *Operational Plans – Primary Care Health and Wellbeing Strategy*

Colleagues shared initial drafts of their operational plans for each theme contained within the Primary Care Strategy approved by PCCC last year. These are included elsewhere on the agenda but will be operationally monitored by the PCWG with exception reports provided to PCCC throughout the year.

Discussion centred on the ambition to map the current primary care workforce in Bury, the CCG knows that that establishing a baseline will be tricky for all primary care providers, the GP Federation have offered assistance with medical services. There is a piece of work being undertaken at GM level but the timeframes for this are not yet known.

Communication will be key to ensuring the delivery of this strategy. The Committee have previously recognised that Bury is progressing well in developing links between all strands of primary care and piece of work is being undertaken to map all of the communication elements of each operational plan.

### *Primary Care Performance Dashboard*

The workstream was presented with an initial draft of the dashboard which will be used by the Committee. This data will be drawn together from various sources and can be used by the Committee to spot trends which may require investigation.

### *Primary Care Quality Visits*

One quality visit was undertaken this month, recommendations have been made which the practice have six months to successfully carry out before the follow up visit. Quality visits will continue to be an important part of the work of the team, the CCG is currently awaiting confirmation from the Care Quality Commission that practices rated as 'Good' will not receive a follow up visit for another five years.

### *Primary Care Risks*

There are currently seven risks on the primary care risk register, five of these had been reviewed during the last reporting period. Of these five, three were proposed for closure by the owner. The workstream was happy to support these for closure which are presented on the PCCC agenda. Items discussed previously in the update are captured under other risks which sit on the register.
